## Confidence Course

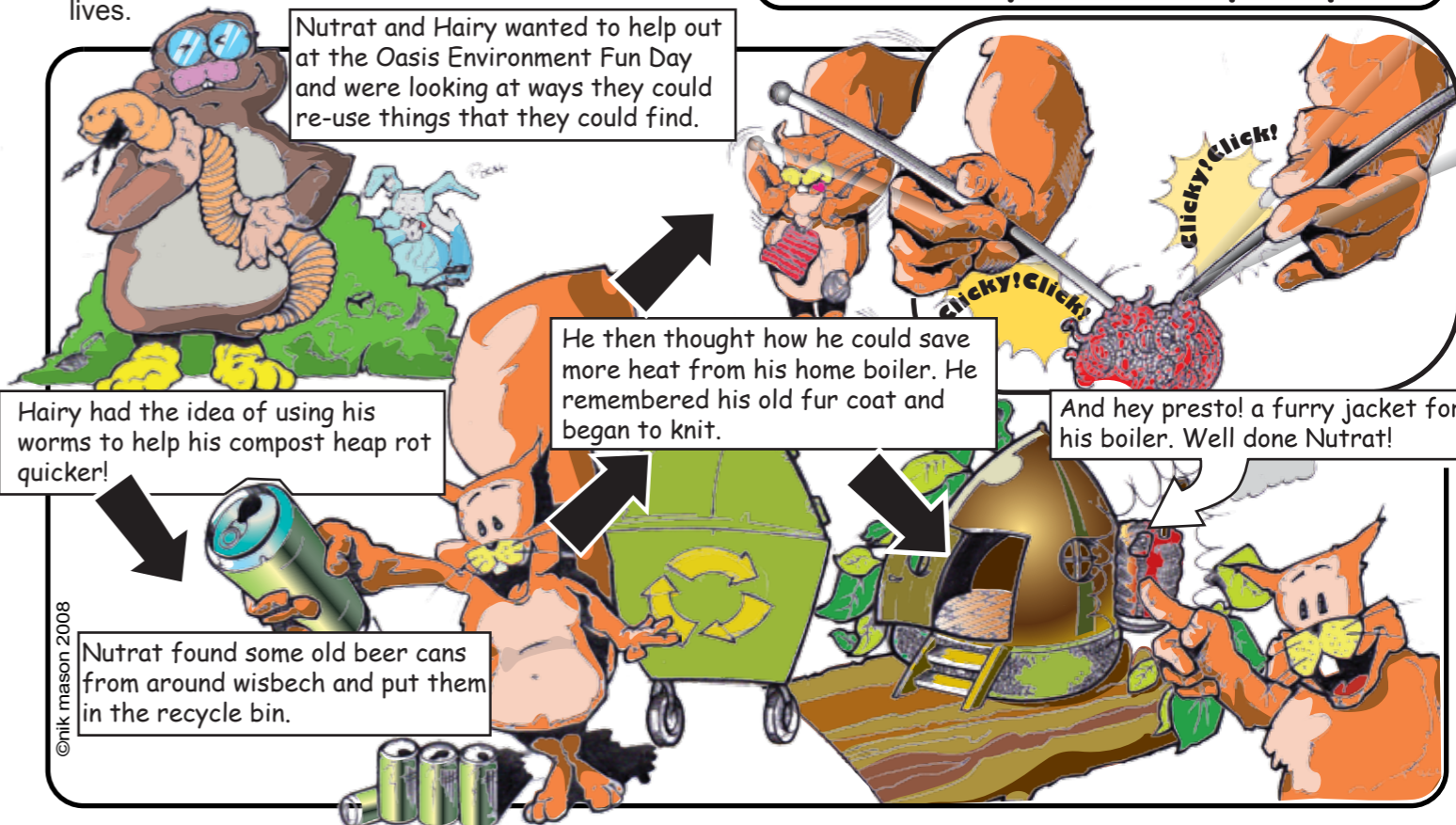
